God is the sole _____ of the Bible

2 Timothy 3:16

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

God Himself is the author of the Bible, and although He used human penmen, the content itself is directly from Him. The Bible is His direct message to us so that we can be sure of His desire for us and His thoughts towards us. We do not have to rely on a man to tell us what God has said—God told us Himself.

God used two methods to record the Bible—

Revelation is God communicating previously unknown/unrevealed truth. Inspiration is God having that truth specifically recorded. Not all revelation is inspiration (In the book of Revelations, John talked about seeing things that

he was instructed not to record).

The Bible is the most valuable source of _____ available to us.

2 Peter 1:19-20

19 We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts: 20 Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.

Despite Peter having had personal interaction with Jesus, he believed that Christians had a greater form of truth available to them in the scriptures.

God used human _____ to record scripture

2 Peter 1:21

For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

God did not supernaturally come down and write scripture with His own hand. Instead, He used Godly men to record His words. God describes the men He used to write down God's inspiration as holy and men of God. We should also highlight that when God inspired these men, the inspiration was not that of a musician writing a song or a painter creating a mural. Instead, the word "inspiration" here means "God-breathed". God breathed the words and the human penmen wrote them down.

Matthew 4:4

But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

While God did allow the personalities and experiences of these men to be part of the written Word of God, it did not make the Bible any less His words. The thoughts and truths did not originate with these men but were given to them directly from God Himself. The book we hold in our hands is, without question, the Word of God.

God preserved the Bible through _____

²“There are over five thousand preserved manuscripts of the New Testament alone—all tediously copied with the utmost care— dating all the way back to approximately ad 130.¹ This is more evidence than any secular author such as Pliny or Aristotle have that their work is credible and authentic. The New Testament is the most well-attested to piece of ancient literature in the world.”

1 Timothy 3:15

But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth.

As an organism created by God, it is the responsibility of the church to treat scripture with the greatest importance. The Word of God is our direct source of truth and is enough for us to live the Christian life. (2 Peter 1:3) The church must use truth to hold up it's teaching and practice in every area.

Matthew 28:19-20

19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

It is the responsibility of every Christian to teach the Word of God to others. While we are learning truth, we are instructed to “teach others also”. (2 Timothy 2:2)

Understanding the Bible _____ the Holy Spirit's guidance

1 Corinthians 2:12-14

12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. 13 Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. 14 But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

An unsaved person will have a very limited ability to understand the Word of God. The Christian, however, is led by the greatest aid to understanding the truths contained in scripture—the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit illuminates the Bible for us to have a full understanding of it.
