REPACK YOUR BAGGAGE

One of the realities in contemporary society is that most couples come to marriage with previous sexual experience, either with each other, or with other partners. The commonly held idea is that sexual experience before marriage better prepares you for marriage. All of the research, both secular and Christian, indicates otherwise. In fact, the divorce rate is twice as high among those who have been sexually active before marriage. The Christian answer to the problem is to stop the wrong behavior, confess it to God and your spouse, and to genuinely forgive each other for past failures. The scars of the past may remain, but they can serve as a reminder of God's love and grace and appreciation for what He has given you in each other. God can and does forgive us and restore us in relationship with Him and each other.



Sexual Abuse: A surprisingly high number of women have been sexually abused at some time in their life, usually as children or teens. Depending on the extent of the abuse this can have a profound effect on a marriage, especially in the area of trust and physical intimacy. The loving husband must be very careful in how he handles this subject. A woman can feel assaulted all over again just talking about it. There are a number of good Christian books written dealing with this sensitive issue. Counseling for her and as a couple is also very important if not necessary.

Sexual Immorality: Statistically 60% of people are not virgins when they get married. This baggage can range from having lived an impure lifestyle before or after salvation, to a one time "mistake", or to going too far in your own premarital relationship. No matter which it is it is still hard to deal with for both partners. Guilt is a powerful emotion that can hinder and overpower all other feelings, even love. Both partners need to individually and together confess their sin before God. It is not always necessary to share past indiscretion but many times a failure to do so will keep your relationship from going forward. A lot depends on how you and your marriage are being affected by the guilt of past sin. It is never necessary or healthy to your marriage to share the details of the past except under competent counseling.

Pornography: 99% of men have been exposed to pornography to some degree by the time they are married. Many men continue to struggle with this addiction after they are married. Pornography should have no place in a healthy marriage. Any man struggling with this problem needs help. In a sense, each man brings all of the women that he has looked at into bed with him each time he has sex with his wife. Many sexual fantasies that he expects his wife to fulfill are based on what he has seen or read. His wife is unfairly being asked to compete with fantasy super-sex women who do not exist in real life. Pornography does not enhance good sex in marriage it destroys it. This is an area that a husband must deal with now both in confessing the past and forsaking the present. Dispose of any and all pornography, both hard and soft core. Like all addictions you must not allow any of it to remain in your life. Explain to your wife how much you were exposed to before your marriage and ask her forgiveness and understanding of how this has affected your relationship.
